INTRODUCTION

Welcome to the Journal of Astronist Studies

The Journal of Astronist Studies (JAS) is an annual peer-reviewed academic journal published by the Astronist Institution. It the only journal in the world to focus solely on published research papers on space religions and philosophies of space exploration. Although the origins of the Journal are Astronist, the Journal accepts papers from across the spectrum of Astronic religions and philosophies including Cosmist, Cosmodeist and even secular perspectives.

The aim of the Journal of Astronist Studies is to advance the study of space religions and the doctrine of transcension in particular as an academic discipline alongside other branches of the study of religion. Another primary objective of the Journal is to explore various aspects of Astronism including its eschatology, philosophy and theology to develop understanding of Astronism as a new religious movement.

The Journal of Astronist Studies is published annually every August beginning in August 2024 and its volume changes every two years i.e. the August 2024 edition will be Volume 1 Issue 1 and the August 2025 edition will be Volume 1 Issue 2. The publication of the Journal is supported by the Astronist Institution.

The Journal of Astronist Studies was first conceived by Cometan on 29th April 2023. The Journal welcomes submissions from academics at different stages of their careers from seasoned scholars to young researchers.

Endnotes: the Journal uses endnotes signposted with Roman numerals in-text. Please do not include in-text references.

Ibid: you may use the abbreviation ibid. in your reference list but only to refer to a single work cited in the note immediately preceding.

Footnotes: the Journal does not allow for in-text footnotes. Any footnoted information will be located at the end of the article in the endnotes.

Reference style: the Journal uses the standard Harvard referencing style.

SUBMISSION

Submission checklist

When you come to submit your article for review, please submit a main document that includes your article in addition to a separate secondary document including your name, an abstract for your article of 200 words, five to six keywords, a biographical note, your email and other contact information including your ORCiD and profile page on your institution's website.

You may submit these two documents in either Pages or Microsoft Word (DOC or DOCX) format.

Before submitting, please ensure your paper reflects the following instructions:

Author identification: for your initial submission, please do not include your name in the manuscript to maintain the blind peer-review. Only include your name in the secondary document. If you make self-referential statements that mention your name in your work or your work is referenced in the reference list then please replace your name with [Author]. If your article is accepted then you will need to reinsert your name during the final revisions stage.

Word count: please ensure your submitted article is between 4,000 and 10,000 words inclusive of references.

Biographical note: please supply a short biographical note for each author of no more than 200 words.

Disclosure statement: this is to acknowledge any financial or non-financial interest that has arisen from the direct applications of your research. If there are no relevant competing interests to declare please state this as follows: *The authors report there are no competing interests to declare*. This declaration should be included below the title of your article in the main document.

Figures: figures should be high quality. Figures should be supplied in one of our preferred file formats: JPEG or PNG.

Funding details: please supply all details required by your funding and grant-awarding bodies as follows:

For single agency grants

For multiple agency grants
